#### A Little Piece of History

During the last fifty years, as social habits have changed, pubs have declined greatly in number. Currently there is only one pub in the parish where there were previously five. Longwick once had five pubs – now there is one.

The oldest pub in our parish was 'The Old Queen's Head' in Marsh – which was a pub for

drovers driving cattle to Smithfield - who seemed to have worked in relays - so Marsh was a changeover point. As the Old Queens Head closed a local cottage - originally known as Postbox Cottage – operated initially as simply a house which served beer - a common thing in Victorian times. When the building was altered to offer more facilities the post box was moved and the pub became 'The Prince of Wales'. The Prince of Wales in question was later King Edward VII and he visited the area to hunt with 'The Old Berkeley Hunt' – often accompanied by his mistress – Lady Jersey.

The Bernard Arms was originally called 'The Chequers' and its name was changed to 'The Bear and Cross' when Scrope Bernard bought the old manor of Bullbeck in 1804. Later the name was changed to the Bernard Arms – now sadly demolished. Interestingly the publicans seemed to have operated in cooperation because the daughters of the last landlord of the Old Queens Head married other publicans. One married the son of the landlord of the Bernard Arms and the other daughter married the publican of the newly opened Swan and Brewer, now 'The Swan'. Initially the Swan was refused a licence partly on the grounds that only one house was close to the pub. The landlord had to diversify for a time and used the pub garden, now part of 'the village green', as a coal yard. When he was granted

a licence he put up a large sign directing passers by to the pub of his brother in law – the Bernard Arms.

The other pub in the parish was 'The Rose and Crown' – later 'The Crown' - at Little Kimble and was for a long time in the ownership of the Chilton family. It was very typical of pubs of those days in that it shared premises with another business – a butchers. *Roger Howgate*
