# Coronation Trivia

Of Queen Elizabeth II Memories from 1953 Of the day in Kimble

The morning of the Coronation was wet and dark for the time of year.

Everyone crowded around the little nine-inch television screens in the houses of those with a television. (Televisions cost around 50 guineas in those days), those in the front of the crowded living room were shouted at to sit down.

There was a fancy dress party at the Stewart Hall in the afternoon, fortunately the weather was drier. However, some of the red, white and blue costumes' colours had run in the rain.

Everybody had a Coronation Mug and a good time was had by all. Gerald Redding's father cast a step for the back door and inscribed it with the date 2<sup>nd</sup> June 1953.

Bunting and flags were flying everywhere.

# Coronations in the 20<sup>th</sup> Century

The Coronation of Edward VII was especially marked in the village because as Prince of Wales he had visited the Old Berkeley Hunt on several occasions and was known locally. The coronation was scheduled for 26<sup>th</sup> June 1902 but had to be postponed as the King required emergency surgery for an abcess. Unlike his mother's coronation which had been rather parsimonious his was a grand affair.

# The Coronation of George V –

Edward's son – in 1911 was also a grand affair - but not so significant in the village. It was to be the last great event for many of the crowned heads of Europe – notably the Tsar of Russia, The Austrian Emperor, and the Kaiser of Germany – since all were overthrown in the First World War.

The Coronation of George VI took place in 1937 on the day that his brother Edward VIII was supposed to have been crowned – but who had abdicated the throne to marry Wallis Simpson. The village was decorated on that day and there are photographs of the Smokey Row cottages in Bridge Street with bunting displayed. A lot of Londoners took the side of Edward VIII in the abdication crisis, but local people were generally not sympathetic ......and the events of the Second World War rather supported their verdict.

The Coronation of Elizabeth II was marked in the village by visits to London by coach to see the coronation displays and lights.

Amongst the events in the village was the election of Kimble's very own Coronation Queen – Rose Moody.
