A Little Bit of

History..... **Recently Keir Starmer and** his family have been seen at Chequers and out and about locally. Long time residents are used to seeing Prime Ministers and their families and are generally discreet over details, following an unspoken code that Prime Ministers and their families are acknowledged politely but not intruded upon. It is interesting to me that local people often have a very different perspective on Prime Ministers to that of historians, since I have a foot in both camps.

The first Prime Minister to use Chequers was David Lloyd George who has a high reputation amongst some historians as the originator of the Old Age Pension and a successful war leader in the First World War but who was very unpopular locally – not only for his flagrant affair with his unfortunate secretary - Frances Stevenson – but also for having a very bad-tempered dog and a scarcely less badtempered wife who hated Chequers, and some badlybehaved children whose insulting behaviour to the Emperor of Japan cannot have helped Anglo-Japanese relations at a sensitive time. His eldest daughter Megan was an exception, but perhaps it's easy to be wellbehaved when you are the favourite.

By contrast, Neville Chamberlain has a very low status with historians for his appeasement of Hitler. Yet was very popular locally for his attitude to local people and concern for their welfare and his concern for the countryside environment [rather unfashionably at the time]. When he found out that he had terminal cancer he expressed a wish to be buried on Beacon Hill – but ended up in Westminster Abbey. Perhaps this was as well since many Chequers dogs are buried on the hill.
