Public Footpath to **Ragpit Hill Open Access Area**

Some points to note

The 1805 Enclosure Act created this public ragpit. [That is why the Chequers Estate gate is up the drive their boundary is to the left of the edge of the old drive-Higbill Close]

In 1954 it was purchased by **Bucks County Council** As landowner BCC put up Footpath signs at each end of the footpath.

The Chiltern Society put up disks and notices confirming this.

If a PROW is used continuously for 20 years it is legitimised This PROW had been used regularly for 220 years. Some residents have used it continuously for at least the last 40 Years.

A magistrates "stop order" is required to close it. The Chiltern Society is named as a necessary consultee under the PROW Act

There is no Magistrates' "stop order" and the Chiltern Society has not been consulted.

The land has not been legally conveyanced to the Chequers Estate – so they are **not** the landowner of land to the right of the drive

If this footpath is closed how do the public access the open access land at Ragpit Hill??? In 1921 and again in 1940 it was local people using footpaths who detected and reported security threats.

You cannot be arrested for trespass. Taking down signs and putting up a notice does not close a PROW Regular footpath walkers are

decent law abiding people. Adaption of the notice put up by Roaer Howaate

A ragpit is where there is lower chalk hard enough for use as foundations for roads.
