and the little bit of history..... All Saints' Church is remarkable for its wall paintings, dated by experts from about 1370. The church's history is surprisingly controversial, and you may not find a guide in there because

a gentleman who believes the wall paintings are a hundred years older than all of the experts say tears up and throws away any guide put in there. I have never actually met him, but he harangued one of the flower ladies on one occasion.

The confusion on dates is because there was an earlier church referred to in documents which stood about 100 vards to the east of the existing church on one of the two mottes [mounds] and was part of the castle of the De Bolbecks. It was demolished in about 1265 as the castle was slighted by the king as punishment for rebellion. The only part of that church which survives above ground is the font which was transferred to the present church but is much older. The church is a puzzle because half of it is built in the Early English style dated by Sir Nicholas Pevsner at 1300 and half is built in the later Decorated style. Several guides to churches suggest that half of the church was knocked down to widen it but the newer half of the church is narrower than the older half and the difference is only about a foot so I think it is unlikely that they would knock down half a church to make it marginally narrower.

The real reason is that the church was begun in about 1300 but in 1314/1316 the village of Little Kimble [which used to stand around the castle] was wiped out by a terrible famine accompanied by a plague which killed all the cattle which not only provided meat but were the draught animals that pulled the ploughs. So, the church was left unfinished for many years until it was finished in a later architectural style and the wall paintings added. So that's why the church is asymmetrical and the church that the gentleman refers to is the original church long since demolished. Roger Howgate
