Harvest used to be the key time of

HARVEST

year for an agricultural society because a poor harvest would mean starvation of people and animals and might lead to a shortage of seed for planting the next year. Harvest traditionally began on the first of August - Lammas Day - a guarter day in Scotland. Lammas is derived from "loaf mass" when the first loaves from the year's crops could be baked. The harvest was incredibly labour intensive and lasted from dawn to dusk. Parents were so heavily involved in the harvest that young children tended to be locked out of the house and left to their own devices or to the care of slightly older siblings, or of the elderly and infirm. The one break in the week came on Sunday as there were laws restricting work on the sabbath. Reaping and binding had to be finished before Michaelmas -29th September a Quarter Day in England. Then came the grindingly laborious work of threshing which went on until All Saints' Day - 1st November. In the 1820's steam threshing machines were introduced and led in this area to the "Swing Riots" where threshing machines were wrecked because they took away work for farm labourers. Two members of the parish were hanged for destroying a threshing machine at a farm in Bishopstone. The harvest involved the majority of the population and lasted for at least three months. At the end of the harvest there were harvest meals paid for by the large landowners. Nowadays the harvest is so mechanised that it takes only a few days and we hardly notice it. A whole culture and way of life has gone. In some ways this is a good thing as the backbreaking toil and child neglect have gone, but so has a whole series of cooperative community activities and a closeness to the land and the cycles of nature.
